Vianne Timmons

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Dr. Vianne Timmons, who has been President of the University of Regina since 2008, is a nationally and internationally recognized expert in inclusive education and family literacy research.

She maintains an active research program which over the years has included projects such as: improving the educational environment for children with disabilities in India; developing family literacy programs for rural families, Aboriginal communities, and newcomers to Canada; and exploring connections between inclusive education and children's health.

In 2010, Dr. Timmons received the Canadian Association for Community Living's National Inclusive Education Award for her commitment to persons with disabilities. In 2012, the Canadian Association for Education Psychology honoured her with the Carol Crealock Memorial Award in recognition of her career as a researcher, teacher and mentor in the field of education psychology.

Dr. Timmons currently serves as President of the International Association for the Scientific Study of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities.
